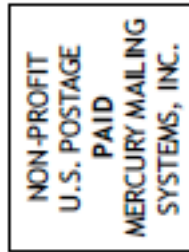

Daniel Paul, Ph.D. has specialized in the understanding and treatment of primitive mental states. He has presented and published several papers in this area. This paper asserts that the patient's readiness to allow himself/herself to regress is facilitated when the analyst remains emotionally engaged. Emotional engagement with the patient provides an atmosphere of safety that allows the patient to regress further. Understanding the nature of the regression and one's countertransference responses to regressed mental states facilitates engagement. Countertransference responses to the patient's dependant demands, suicidal behavior and primitive fantasies are discussed.

Daniel Paul, Ph.D. is a Supervising and Training Analyst with the Los Angeles Institute and Society for Psychoanalytic Studies. He is a member of the Faculty at LAISPS and the Wright Institute.
