



ALTERED STATES of Body and Mind

Psychoanalytic theory posits substance abuse, eating disorders and other addictive behaviors are ways of coping with intensely distressing states of body and mind. The substance or behavior gives the patient an illusion of a restored self - immune to narcissistic injury, abandonment, rage and in some cases, the terror of "coming apart."

This 30-week course begins with a review of classical and contemporary psychoanalytic theories on addiction, eating disorders, dissociation and primitive states of mind. We explore the neurobiology of addiction, brain development and anxious attachment strategies developed in childhood.

We use object relations theory to understand drug abuse, eating problems and other addictive behaviors such as sex, gambling, internet/gaming and high-risk activities. We identify the special concerns of patients who are dangerously overweight or who binge on various substances. We then uncover transference communications and the potential for powerful countertransference enactments.

Finally, we explore the dialogue between personality disorders and addiction and we imagine the patient whose addictive behaviors are a response to an underlying psychotic process. At the end of the course, students will meet guest lecturers from adjunct modes of treatment including nutrition, psychiatry and other intensive levels of care.

Our Altered States of Body and Mind Program is designed for a wide range of mental health professionals, at all levels of experience, including psychiatrists, psychologists, social workers, and MFTs who are looking to deepen their work with their patients.
